	The September 2018 staffing structures were presented to governors and accepted.

4/18	2018 Main Data Messages – Y6 SATs
<p>Reading increased from 67% in 2017 to 84% (DPs 67%) and was above the national average of 75%</p> <p>Writing increased from 80% in 2017 to 89% (DPs 75%) and was above the national average of 78%</p> <p>Maths increased from 76% in 2017 to 89% (DPs 75%) and was above the national average of 76%</p> <p>SPaG increased from 76% in 2017 to 84% (DPs 67%) and was above the national average of 78%</p> <p>Reading, writing and maths combined increased from 67% in 2017 to 84% (DPs 67%) and was above the national average of 64%</p> <p>The gap between DPs and non DPs was reduced in reading and writing and being above the national average for combined.</p> <p>Governors were delighted with the improvement and Mrs Moss and the governors thanked Mrs Osborne and Mr Harper for all their hard work.</p> <p>Governors are aware that the current Y5 cohort is unlikely to achieve results that are this high due to the proportion of SEN pupils in the cohort.</p>	
5/18	2018 Main Data Messages – Y2 SATs
<p>All results were higher than school results in 2017 and higher than the 2017 national averages.</p> <p>Reading 88% at expected; 80% DPs – 33% at greater depth; 20% DPs</p> <p>Writing 86% at expected; 80% DPs – 16% at greater depth; 13% DPs</p> <p>Maths 92% at expected; 93% DPs – 29% at greater depth; 20% DPs</p> <p>DPs have made accelerated progress and have diminished the difference with non DPs</p> <p>Writing at greater depth in maths was the same as 2017 national average and lower than school in 2017 and 2016. There will be a focus on improving vocabulary to address this in 2018-19</p> <p>Overall school and governors were pleased with the results particularly the % of expected and the attainment and progress of the DPs.</p>	
6/18	2018 Main Data Messages – Phonics Screening Check
<p>88% of Y1 pupils passed the phonics screening check. This is the same as last year and above the 2017 national average of 81%.</p> <p>55% of Y1 DPs passed the phonics screening check. This is still lower than non DPs and lower than the 77% last year. 3 out of the 4 DPs who did not pass the phonics screening check are SEN with 1 having just arrived at the school.</p> <p>96% of Y2 pupils passed the phonics screening check. This is higher than the 92% last year and higher than the 2017 national average of 92%</p>	
7/18	2018 Main Data Messages – EYFS Profile
<p>78% of pupils achieved a Good Level of Development. This was equal to the target based on the baseline results and 2017 results but lower than the 80% achieved in 2016.</p> <p>The vast majority of pupils have made accelerated progress,</p> <p>DPs still performed lower than the non DPs with only 50% (3 children) achieving a GLD. This is the same as the 50% in 2017 and lower than the 57% in 2016. Diminishing the difference in early years</p>	

is still a priority for the school.
